We are fully funded and ready to get rolling!

Thank you, Daybreak Family, for making this “Summer of Extraordinary” a blessing to ALL campers and cabin leaders for many years to come!

Here is a schedule of how we plan to achieve the transformation of cabins 1-9.

To be efficient and effective each phase of construction will be performed on all the cabins at once, so you may or may not work on your cabin.

Below is the work schedule, most weeks are Wednesday through Saturday.

JULY	
8-9	Move out mattresses and bunks
15-18	Dig out and around cabins - Foundation work
22-25	Remove doors & windows, intercoms, signs & numbers, nails, staples etc.
29-30	Finish any loose ends – Cabins should be a shell and ready to upgrade
AUGUST	
5-8	Framing - Repair & install
12-14	Electrical work
19-22	Prep and paint bunks – Install wood – Build windows
26-29	Interior and exterior siding
SEPTEMBER	
16-18	Paint interior and exterior
23-26	Install doors and windows
OCTOBER	
Sept.30-3	Install lights, smoke detectors, loose ends
7-10	Install bunks and mattresses

The dates and projects listed are broad strokes, of course there are a ton of little unforeseen snafus that will hold us up or move us forward, we call that “*camp happens*” around here!

We are aware that some of you are unable to volunteer, that is okay, we (Rich, Marci & Devin) are committed to the work and will be on the job **8am – 5pm**. We are hoping that anyone who would like to and can volunteer will do so on these days. **Be sure to let us know you are coming!!**

Bring: Gloves, your personal protection mask, tools (check with Rich on tools needed for the work at hand) and a lunch.

Provided: Bottled water, prepackage snacks, sanitizer.

We have consulted with Santa Cruz Health Services Agency for guidance on practice and protocol for maintaining a safe workspace and plan to operate in this manner, they are as follows.

We will host small work parties 10-12 on any given work scheduled workday.

Mask will be required when working in proximity with one another.

Everyone will bring their own lunch – no kitchen services, dining will be physically distanced (but social!)

Provided: Prepackaged snacks and bottled water if you forgot your personal water bottle.

If you plan make this a Mission Trip or Family Work Camp and stay overnight(s) – bring a tent or RV, there will be no kitchen access for cooking and food storage, plan accordingly. Restrooms and showers will be available.
