Volunteer Opportunities for Daybreak Summer Camp Programs

Your \$85.00 Volunteer fee helps cover costs & applies to all positions

WS - WildSide, for youth who have completed 6-8 grades

FDC - Faith Development Camp, for teens who have completed 9-12 grades

AC - Adventure Camp, for children who have completed 2-5 grades

FC - Family Camp, for everyone who needs a little kid in them!

Adult Cabin Leader's)

Mature Christian adult, enjoys youth & cabin life, provides positive role modeling through action and speech. **(2 adults in each cabin) Each camp needs 8 women and 8 men**

AC - WS - FDC

Cabin Leader in Training—CIT

Mature Christian Youth & young adult, cabin support for Adult Cabin Leaders and campers, enjoys cabin life, provides positive role modeling through action and speech

(4-5 females & 4-5 males)

AC - WS - FDC

Health Supervisor (RN) (LVN) (Physician)

“Health Supervisor” means a person who is either a physician, registered nurse, licensed vocational nurse who is licensed pursuant to Division 2 of the Business and Professions Code or a person who is trained in accordance with section 1596.866 of the Health and Safety Code.

Collects all medications from campers and cabin staff at registration. Logs information. Doses meds through the week.

Maintains infirmary and medical records. Cares for campers. Disburses meds at the conclusion of camp.

AC (2-3),WS & FDC (1)

Kitchen Help / Meal Preparation

Under the direction of the Head Cook/Food Service Manager—

Assist with meal preparations, serving, and end of meal/day/week clean up.

(5+ volunteers at each meal, daily)

AC - WS - FDC - FC

*This position allows for commuting and flexibility with amount of days volunteering

Kitchen & Dining Hall Coordinator

Liaison between kitchen and dishwashing/dining hall cleaning. Oversees volunteer washing of pots & pans, dishwashing, kitchen & dining hall floor cleaning daily & end of camp.

Participates / over sees volunteers/campers in the dish washing process.

Sets up and breaks down dish washing station. runs Hobart Sanitizer, put dishes away.

AC - WS - FDC - FC

Snack Shack Coordinator

Sets up and breaks down operation of smoothie making. Makes smoothies, snow cones and/or popcorn to be served in the afternoons. Prepares and delivers the evening snack. Cleans the snack shack at the end of the camp week.

AC - WS - FDC - FC

Night Patrol

Cares for the campers and Daybreak Property maintaining a safe environment, ensures that campers adhere to lights out and stay put. Can be a late night.

AC - WS - FDC

Photography

Take creative and engaging photos during the week, edit and upload on-line.

PA / Sound Booth

Must have keen knowledge of sound equipment / computer to video equipment. Support the leadership teams.

Pre Camper Care

Under the leadership of the pre camper care coordinator, help provide "day camp" experience for the children of AC volunteers who are not old enough to be a camper. Curriculum, materials and supplies are provided. **(2-5 adults) Depends on number of children registered.**

Bible Class Teacher

Under the leadership of the curriculum coordinator, teaches provided camp themed material. **(8 - 10 Adults) Each small group has 2 teachers and 1 Teen.**

Under the leadership of the Activities Coordinator, lead/supervise morning & afternoon activities. Activities: Mountain biking, archery, bb guns, crafts, leather, hula hoops, swimming, board games, tree trolley, hiking, blow darts, lawn games, fishing, 9 square, basketball, ping pong, carpet ball and more. **(20-25 adults)**

Volunteer positions for Teens and Young Adults

O.T.S. - Opportunity To Serve - Adventure Camp

Under the direction of 2 adult leaders, 6-8 graders assist the camp program serving in a variety of positions, from washing dishes to activities.

There are approximately 20 spots:

FIRST - Youth whose parents are volunteering will be automatically be accepted.

SECOND - Youth who also attend WildSide

JCrew - High school age volunteers for Adventure Camp & WildSide

Under the direction of the OTS leadership or WildSide leadership will assist in a variety of roles from setting up/breaking down and execution of programmed activities to washing pots and pans.

Must attend FDC to serve as JCrew.

Crew - College age volunteers

Under the direction of the leadership team Crew will Assist the program leaders with set up/break down, execution of program activities.

T.O.C. - Turn Over Crew

Unable to volunteer during the week? Join us for "TURN OVER" at the end of WildSide, FDC, Adventure Camp & Family Camp.

The care and safety of our campers ia a priority! As volunteers you can also help insure their safety by becoming knowledgeable and trained in all areas of Daybreaks Camp 5 Step Safety Program.

Step One: Sexual Abuse Awareness Training - MINISTRYSAFE

Staff and volunteers should have a basic understanding of the characteristics of sexual abusers, as well as "grooming behaviors" used by abusers to select and prepare a child for sexual abuse. Grooming is the process used an abuser to select a child, win the child's trust (and the trust of the child's care- giver or 'gatekeeper'), manipulate the chills into sexual activity and keep the child from disclosing the abuse. To equip volunteers with the information necessary to recognize abuser characteristics and grooming behavior, Daybreak Camp requires all staff and volunteers 18 years and older to complete MinistrySafe sexual abuse awareness training. This can be done at your leisure in your home.

Once you have registered as a volunteer, Daybreak will send you a link, we will be notified when you have completed this training.

Step two: Screening process

Complete the volunteer registration application on line at www.daybreakcamp.org (If you are volunteering for the first time, please include two references to be check) Complete the Volunteer Application, including a signed release and health form.

Step Three: Review Polices & Procedures

Volunteers are required to review the polices contained in the manual that will be emailed when your registration application is received. A signature is required on the last page of the manual that you will detach and send to Daybreak Camp.

Step Four: Background Check

Daybreak Camp will perform a web based background screening for all new volunteers.

Step Five: Become CPR & First Aid Certified

It is ideal for everyone to be First Aid/CPR certified, however, we understand that may not be possible. From time to time Daybreak will offer a day long class separate from camp.
